SHOPPING

There is a limited selection on the Island - newspapers and sundries are available from the Post Office - they open daily at 9.00am. Opening times are often tide dependent, particularly in the winter season. Large supermarkets (Asda, Tesco and Morrisons) are all in Berwick and small supermarkets in Belford.

The butcher from Bamburgh, with their famous Bamburgh Bangers, visits on a Thursday during the summer season - time is tide dependent.

The Lindisfarne Mead and Gift Shop is open year-round as is the gin shop - 793 Spirits.

EATING OUT

The restaurants on the island do get booked up, so we suggest calling in early in your stay to book a table for later in the week.

The Crown & Anchor, The Manor House Hotel and The Ship Inn serve pub meals at both lunchtime and for evening meals (times vary throughout the year). The Pilgrims Coffee House is open all day for great coffee and light meals - they roast their own coffee on site!

There is also the Chare Ends Cafe, formerly known as The Oasis, which has been fully refurbished under new ownership. It serves coffee, cakes and homemade food and can provide a take-away fish platter too suit all budgets if you pop in and order in advance (48 hrs recommended).

1st Class Foods is a licenced cafe attached to the Post Office and is open for breakfast from 9am-11am and with an all day menu from 11am. Opening times are tide-dependent so please keep an eye out locally for current opening times. You can also purchase home cooked ready meals, pastries and cakes from the Post Office to take away.

Off-island we would recommend the Barn at Beal for breakfast and lunches with evening meals served at weekends during the summer season and the Lindisfarne Inn next to the A1 for standard pub grub.

Our extended family have also discovered amazing seafood at the Ship Inn in Seahouses (booking recommended) and other places we have tried are Beadnell Towers or The Percy Arms at Chatton for a special treat, Audela in Berwick for contemporary British cuisine or Limoncello for a vibrant Italian experience.
